Tools and Things for Work Party & Race Weekend

Here's a list of some of the necessary things you will need to bring along with anything else you might think of:

1. Your motorcycle should be in good shape with a dual sport, play bike or quad preferred. Race bikes tend to make poor work bikes.
2. Daypack, number plate bag for carrying your tools, ribbon, cards, supplies and trash bags.
3. Canteen, camelback or other source of drinking water you can carry while riding and working.
4. Hammer, mini sledge or ball peen hammers work well. Steel hammer loop to hang on your belt with a velcro strap to hold it in.
5. Steel rod. (18" x 3/4") or other steel tool to start pilot holes in hard ground.
6. Heavy Duty staple gun with 1000 1/4" staples.
7. Inner tube rubber bands, bungee cords, rope for tying things together and onto your bike.
8. Lightweight bag (like your camp chairs come in) for carrying stakes.
9. Black broad tip marker for making road-crossing signs.

Updated Referee Report:

This is what we are going to need and have to do for the 100's race.

1. Need people for the National 1st & 2nd Loop Finish, Team Race Finish & Checks and Sign Ups.
2. Need to update the phone list and cell phones, in case of emergency-Contact Mindy Mongeon at 760-375-9669.
3. Per District 37-There will be NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES being consumed by any of the club members before or during the race. Drinking is not permitted by anyone who is a 100's member or working with the 100's before or during the race event.
4. Everyone that is working our race and all members must wear club colors (yellow shirts), on both days, both weekends. If you need to purchase a yellow 100's shirt, you may do so at the Argubrights RV, all sizes available.
5. A responsible adult can only do all checks, writing numbers down of riders passing through a check. Anyone that has an assigned job, must go to their assigned job, and not be out watching the races. You must stay at your area and help clean up until sweep comes through, or your pit captain says you can go.
6. Everyone in the club must sign in and fill in what loop they are working on, and stay working on that loop. You will not be riding both courses unless get an okay from the President or Referee.

Qualifications: Must have been an active 100's M.C. member as of June 1st. this year. Be a member of the AMA (Required by AMA and for Club Officers), a District 37 cardholder, club dues paid up, and for the officers who are club board of directors they must be over the age of 18. Being willing and able to serve is important, too.

Offices:

President: Co-ordinates club activities, presides at all club meetings, and is president of the club board of directors, may be a signature of the club checking account.

Vice-President: Keeps club points, runs meetings in absence of president, may be a signature on the club checking account. This position holds a seat on the board of directors.

Secretary: Takes and publishes minutes of club meetings. Signatory on club checking account and is a member of the board of directors.

Treasurer: Takes charge of receiving and disbursing club funds, keeping records of club finances and property, signatory on club checking account. Reports to club board of directors and members.

Referee: In charge of putting on club race (s), board of directors member, and by District 37 rule, a club representative to District 37.

Sgt at Arms: At meetings and direction of the President and officers, maintains order, collects fines, and runs 50-50 drawing.

The club board of directors is responsible for planning club calendar, setting club goals, supervising, communicating with club members and each other, and the well being of the "100's M.C. Incorporated".
